Bible Readings: Matthew 25: 31-46

When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left.

Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.'

Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?'

And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'

Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.'

Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?'

Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.

Time to Reflect

Do you remember the child's toy spinning tops? I mean the ones that looked a bit like brightly painted spaceships - you pumped them up and down, and when you let them go they spun across the floor. They were no good on carpet, but on a hard floor they would whirl away. I remember my younger brother playing with one - it was bright red, with animals painted around it. When it began to spin, the animals blurred into a single bright stripe - you couldn't see the individual animals, never mind identify which was the lion, the tiger, or the elephant.

I get the same feeling about this story. At first glance, it seems easy to tell the sheep from the goats. But the more you think about it, the harder it gets. If I try to work out who is a sheep, and who is a goat, everything starts to become blurred. I don't even know which category I would fall into!

The people in the story didn't know which category they fall into, either - they didn't even seem to be aware that there are different categories. They were just getting on with their lives, then suddenly found that they were being split into different groups. I wonder if they realised what was going on, and that they were being sorted according to how they responded to seeing others in need.

Some people are hungry - thirsty - don't have adequate clothes to wear - how does that make you feel? That it must be their own fault for spending their money on the wrong things?

Some people are in prison. Do you think about them at all, or is it a case of "out of sight, out of mind"?

The people in the story were being divided according to how they responded to difficult and unsettling situations.

We can withdraw in fear and confusion.

Or we can respond in love and hope, opening our hearts and looking to God to show us the way.
