Readings: 1 Peter 3: 18-22

For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you — not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

Mark 1: 9-15

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

Reflection - Understanding who we are

In these few verses, Mark sets out clearly his understanding of who Jesus is. Jesus is revealed as the Beloved Son, the delight of the Father and visibly graced by the Spirit. Jesus rises from the water and we see clearly how He stands within the fellowship of divine love, the mystery at the heart of God's being which we call the Holy Trinity. Jesus is a cherished child, worthy of love before he has performed any miracles or shared any teachings.

Jesus is also one with needy humanity, standing in solidarity among those come for the cleansing waters of John's Baptism, a cleansing which, as the Letter of Peter reminds us, is more than a thorough wash, and sharing their vulnerability when exposed in the wilderness.

As Messiah, the anointed representative of God's faithful people, Jesus 'rewinds' their story of Exodus and freedom, moving from the water of the Jordan back into the wilderness for a 40 day echo of their forty long years of wandering. Perhaps he 'goes back' even further, living, like Adam in Eden, in the company of the wild beasts.

Using the simplest words, Mark presents a profound summary of who Jesus is. And Mark offers a glimpse into Jesus's own subjective experience, in the pivotal moment of Baptism, Jesus sees the heavens torn open, this is a flash of revelation, a moment when divine reality is seen and known.

Many unhappy and misguided understandings of Lent come from a mistaken understanding of who we are, how God sees us. In the drama of this story, we find not only a revelation of identity of Jesus, but who we are in Him: unconditionally beloved children in whom God delights, weak and needy human beings whose vulnerability Jesus has faced, shared and redeemed, people of God caught up in God's enduring plan of rescue and redemption.
