REFLECTION: JOHN WESLEY

Today we recall the ministry of John Wesley, seen here speaking to a young boy from the Kingswood area of Bristol.

The bronze was created to celebrate the 250th Anniversary of Kingswood School which was founded by John Wesley.

He set up the school for the sons of the miners of Kingswood who were some of the roughest and most deprived people of the time. He gave the boys an education which transformed their lives.



A commitment to education was just one of the many aspects of Wesley's ministry. His 'Pentecost' experience of the warmed heart led to a ministry that changed the lives of thousands of people and also to a worldwide movement numbered in millions. His 'breakout ministry' broke down barriers, opened up new opportunities for countless numbers and challenged the social patterns of the day.

Tomorrow, Monday 24th May, is Wesley Day. I invite you to take a moment during the day to reflect on Wesley's ministry - what we might discover from it in terms of ministry for today and also give thanks for his life.

Jesus said, "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning.

Reflection: Pentecost

Over recent months we have all experienced that sense or concern of 'what will happen next?' - an experience that resonates with that of the disciples between the Easter joy and the feeling of being left behind. Jesus is no longer physically present following the Ascension. What will be the next chapter?

Some of the disciples would be pondering His words and promises and the hopes that they raised for the future - others were hiding away because their expectations had been shattered. Then comes Pentecost and the real sense of the presence of Jesus through the gifts of the Spirit. In a word it was 'Breakout'.

Breakout - because barriers were broken – the language barrier was breached and the crowd was able to understand the message whatever their culture or native tongue. A common understanding was established where the power of the Gospel – the work of the Advocate – was seen at work.

Breakout - because the people were given the confidence to tell the story of the work and life of Christ. The transforming experience of changed lives – the timidity of the disciples changed into the beginning of the Church which over time changed the world. This work continues into the 21st Century as the Pentecost effect works its way through the current generation. This is a world that is still being born as new discoveries are made and prejudices are being overturned.

Breakout - because the Spirit, the Advocate, challenged the world to look again at itself. Those early followers took up the challenge of applying the Gospel to the issues of life - relations across the nations; the sharing of gifts and their distribution - a ministry that continues now. We cannot change the past and we live with sadness over historical events but we can work to ensure a just and peaceful future for all.

Our biblical passages tell of the beginnings of Pentecost – our participation as today's People of God is to continue the story as we use the gifts given to us by God. Let us reflect on the gifts we have received that enable us to be part of the 'Breakout' of the Gospel.

Lord we open our lives afresh today, to the baptism of your Holy Spirit; We are open to be licked by the gentle flames of healing; We are open to be washed by rains from a new horizon; We are open to be inspired by the rainbow of Pentecost blessings; Unite us to be reborn in the radiance of your grace.
